A Few September Reminders

- Thank you to all parents for ensuring that all our children have the correct uniform and shoes for the start of the new school year. They all looked so smart on their first day back! Please encourage your child to take a pride in their school uniform and appearance at all times. As you are aware, pupils are expected to wear black school shoes in school - trainers are not permitted. Cardigans and sweatshirts should be red. Jewellery and make-up are not to be worn.
- All school uniform, including P.E. kit, coats and shoes **must** be named. This will be regularly checked and names written into any un-named uniform in an attempt to reduce lost property.
- Pupils are **not** allowed on school grounds before 8.40 a.m. The doors open at 8.45 a.m. in Juniors and 8.50 a.m. in Infants.
- Please ensure that your child has a water bottle (containing water only) in school every day.
- Pupils in Junior Department are permitted to bring a piece of fruit, a cereal bar or purchase a piece of toast for morning breaktime (purchased via Parentpay a term in advance). No biscuits, sweets or crisps please.
- No dogs or pets apart from assistance dogs are allowed onto the school grounds.
- Please remember that if your child is absent from school you must phone school before 9.30 a.m. to let us know.
- Please ensure emergency contact details are kept updated. If you have changed your home, work or mobile numbers please inform the school office as soon as possible.
- Please take care when parking. **Do not** park on zigzag lines, corners, the pavement or across neighbours' drives. Please do not stop or park in the gateway to the school. We need access in and out of the car park at all times.

Medication in School

Just a reminder that school staff are unable to administer medicines to children during the school day.

Medication for children's short term illnesses e.g. anti-biotics, pain relief should be administered at home. Parents should ask their clinician to prescribe in dose frequencies which enable this to be administered outside of school hours. If this is not possible, the parents/carers have the option to bring medication into school and administer it personally to their child at lunchtime or to nominate a friend or relative to do this for them. The only exceptions to this are for children with long-term medical issues, including asthma, where prior arrangements have been made with the school under advice from the medical adviser. N.B. Children should NOT bring medication, other than inhalers, into school under any circumstances. If you have any queries about medication/asthma inhalers, please speak to Ms McKee, our Senior Learning Mentor.

Sports Clubs

A list of clubs available this half term has been emailed out. Parents are reminded that clubs are booked and paid for through Parentpay. Once all the places are allocated, the club ceases to be accessed on Parentpay.

If your child gains a place, you will then be emailed a letter with a reply slip which needs to be completed and returned if your child has any medical conditions. It is important this is returned, even if we already hold this information in school as some of our clubs are run by outside providers.

If your child has a place at a club and can't attend any sessions (e.g. because they have an appointment after school one day), please let us know so office staff do not have to spend time checking that your child has been collected instead of attending the club.

Parents are also asked to ensure that children have the correct kit/equipment (e.g. shin pads) for the club they are attending.

British Values

Every month we focus on a different 'British Value' in our assemblies and classroom discussions. This month our value is 'being proud'. You may like to talk to your child about what this means; what makes you feel proud and what your child feels proud of - and why.

Behaviour

This week, Mrs Walklett and Mrs Budden are leading Behaviour Assemblies, in which children are reminded about our school rules, rewards and sanctions. We have extremely high expectations of all our pupils and these are shared with pupils both in assemblies and classroom discussions.

All the staff, including Lunchtime Supervisors, have a positive approach to behaviour management.

Recognition is given to pupils who are polite and follow our school and lunchtime rules. For example, Lunchtime Supervisors choose children who have been commended for their good manners to sit on the 'Golden Table' at lunchtime. These children have their

names read out in Friday assembly and enjoy sitting at a specially decorated table the following week.

A member of the Senior Leadership Team has their dinner with the children each day and Mrs Walklett and Mrs Budden walk around school every lunchtime to pick up on any issues and talk with the children in the playgrounds.

Our 'Room for Thought' will continue for children who have been involved in more serious misbehaviour such as stone throwing or fighting. On these occasions, children miss part of lunchtime, spending the session with a teacher to complete a follow-up activity which may be a letter of apology or writing/drawing about what they did wrong and what they could have done instead. Parents are informed if their child has attended 'Room for Thought'.

As with all areas of learning, children learn appropriate behaviour most effectively when school and parents work in partnership. Please speak to your child's class teacher if you have any concerns around behaviour. Our Senior Learning Mentor, Ms McKee is also able to offer advice and support.

SEN (Special Educational Needs) Drop-in Sessions

Our SENCo (Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator), Mrs Hutchings, will be holding drop-in sessions for parents who have any concerns or questions around their child's additional needs. The sessions will be held on the following days/times in the meeting room at the front of school:

Assistance Dog

Whilst the school has a policy of no dogs on our school grounds, specially trained assistance dogs are permitted.

We now have a support dog assisting one of our pupils and accompanying him to and from school. The assistance dog, Willow, is not in school during the day. Willow has been trained by Support Dogs and will be wearing her blue coat to indicate that she is working. Whilst working it is important not to approach and pat Willow.

Attendance

With today's newsletter, we are emailing a letter about Fast-track Attendance. As you may be aware, improving attendance for some groups of pupils was an identified action in our Ofsted Report in June 2017.

The letter explains that it is a parent's legal responsibility to ensure their children receive appropriate education. Failing to send your child to school regularly without good reason is a criminal offence. Head Teachers may not authorise leave during term time except where the circumstances are exceptional.

Please read this letter carefully. Additional copies are available from the main reception if you have not received your copy.

We would like to thank parents who make sure their child is attending school regularly and are therefore benefiting fully from their educational opportunity.
