As part of our ongoing curriculum review and school improvement focus, our curriculum leaders took part in a CPD day on Monday with local schools. This was a valuable opportunity to share good practice between the schools taking part, which included those in our proposed MAT (multi-academy trust). Leaders shared work on planning for progression of skills and knowledge in foundation subjects such as Geography and Art, as well as observing and giving feedback on pupils' work across a range of different subjects.
